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Description

Front: Büste des Vespasianus mit Lorbeerkranz nach r. Im r. F. eingeschlagen die Wertzahl LXXXIII.

Rear: Nach r. schreitender Mars mit geschultertem Siegesmal (tropaeum) und Speer.
Beiderseits S - C.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Punched: Intentionally marked with a punch, both contemporary to the object and later. In contrast to a countermark of a much more simple design. Not to be confused with punches creating a positive image, which were used during the manufacture of a die.
