Description

Front: Artemis Parthenos mit dem Speer nach einem Hirsch stoßend nach l. Im r. F. ein kreisförmiger Gegenstempel mit einem Delphin im Punktrand.

Rear: Stier auf einer Keule stößt mit tief gesenktem Kopf nach l. Darunter [Δ]ΙΑΓΟΡΑ über Bogen und Köcher.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
