Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Hinter dem Ohr ein ovaler Gegenstempel mit Anker.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Hocker (diphros) nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Im l. F. IA, unter dem Thron O. Im l. F. ein rechteckiger Durchhieb samt Riss, wo weiteres Beizeichen zu erwarten ist, daneben von Rs. her Versuch der Durchbohrung.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
