## Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Vergoldet.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Thron nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Im l. F. I über  $\Phi$ . Vergoldet.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Gilded: With an overlay (wholly or in parts) of a thin layer of gold. Process is not part of the regular production.
