## Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Hinter dem Ohr ein ovaler Gegenstempel mit Anker.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Hocker (diphros) nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Im l. F. ΚΓ, unter dem Thron Φ.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Part(s) broken away: Sections of the coin or medal are broken away (without any traces of mechanic manipulation).
