Description

Front: Drapierte Büste der Tranquillina in der Brustansicht nach l.

Rear: Hermes mit Hut (petasos) und Mantel (chlamys) läuft nach r., in seinen Händen hält er einen Heroldstab (kerykeion). Unten das Wertzeichen Δ.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
