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Description

Front: Kopf des C. Iulius Caesar (Octavianus) mit Lorbeerkranz nach r. Unter dem Kopf ein rechteckiger Gegenstempel IMP VES AVG (ligiert).

Rear: Pax steht in der Vorderansicht auf einem Schwert (parazonium?), den Kopf nach l. Sie hält in ihrer r. erhobenen Hand einen Merkurstab (caduceus). Im r. F. eine Cista mystica, aus der sich eine Schlange aufrichtet. Das Ganze in einem Lorbeerkranz.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Overstruck: A coin or medal used as a flan to produce a new coin and that has been struck with a new die.
