## Description

Front: Krummstab (lituus) neben einer Kanne (sitella). Oben Punze X.

Rear: Eine Kanne (sitella) zwischen geflügeltem Blitzbündel l. und Merkurstab (caduceus) r.

Punched: Intentionally marked with a punch, both contemporary to the object and later. In contrast to a countermark of a much more simple design. Not to be confused with punches creating a positive image, which were used during the manufacture of a die.
