## Description

Front: Janusförmiger Dioskurenkopf mit Lorbeerkranz.

Rear: Iupiter in von Victoria gelenktem Viergespann (quadriga) nach r. In der l. Hand hält er ein Zepter, mit der r. Hand schleudert er einen Blitz.

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.
