## Description

Front: Kopf des M. Lepidus nach r.

Rear: Kopf des C. Iulius Caesar (Octavianus) nach r.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
