## Description

Front: Kopf des Gaius Iulius Caesar (Octavianus) nach r. Am Hals und im l. F. je eine halbmondförmige Punze.

Rear: Handschlag (dextrarum iunctio) mit Merkurstab (caduceus). Zwei halbmondförmige Punzen.

Punched: Intentionally marked with a punch, both contemporary to the object and later. In contrast to a countermark of a much more simple design. Not to be confused with punches creating a positive image, which were used during the manufacture of a die.
