Description

Front: Kopf des Marcus Antonius nach r. An Hals, Wange und Schläfe Punzen.

Rear: Kopf des Gaius Iulius Caesar (Octavianus) nach r.

Punched: Intentionally marked with a punch, both contemporary to the object and later. In contrast to a countermark of a much more simple design. Not to be confused with punches creating a positive image, which were used during the manufacture of a die.
