Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Darauf ein runder Gegenstempel mit einem Löwenkopf in der Frontalansicht.

Rear: Artemis steht mit einer langen, schräg gehaltenen Fackel in der Vorderansicht, den Kopf nach r. gedreht. Spuren eines Untertyps mit stehender Nike.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Overstruck: A coin or medal used as a flan to produce a new coin and that has been struck with a new die.
