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Description

Front: Kopf der Athena mit korinthischem Helm nach r.

Rear: Siegesmal (tropaion). Im r. F. unten Reste eines Monogrammes. Im l. F. runder Gegenstempel mit dem Stadtmonogramm ΠΕΡ.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
