Description

Front: Umlaufend Nennung von Münzstätte und Prägejahr. Am Rand links ein Gegenstempel.

Rear: Im Feld: Gott ist einzig Gott ist ewig Er zeugte nicht noch ist er gezeugt worden und es gibt nicht einen neben ihm. Umlaufend Koranvers 9,33, im Feld Koranvers 112,1-3.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Eye/loop removed: A previously attached loop has been removed.
