## Description

Front: Kopf des Constantius I. mit Lorbeerkranz nach r.

Rear: Hercules steht in der Vorderansicht, den Kopf nach l. In seiner r. Hand ein Zweig, im l. Arm die Keule und das Löwenfell.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
