Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Thron nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Unter dem Thron über der Querstrebe ein Monogramm, darunter ein Monogramm. Im l. F. oben innen ein runder Gegenstempel.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
