Description

Front: Kopf des Herakles mit Löwenfellxuvie nach r. Zwei Prüfhiebe.

Rear: Zeus Aetophoros sitzt auf einem Thron nach l., in der l. Hand ein Zepter. Im l. F. ΦΙ.

Unter dem Thron ΒΣ. Im l. F. Graffito M bzw. Σ.

Graffito: Lettering or similar mark incised into the surface of a coin that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin.

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.
