Description

Front: Büste des Caracalla mit Strahlenkrone in der Rückenansicht nach r.

Rear: Kapitolinische Wölfin (lupa romana) steht mit umgewandtem Kopf nach r., Romulus und Remus säugend.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
