Description

Front: Kopf des C. Iulius Caesar (Octavianus) nach r.

Rear: Kopf des Zenodoros nach l. Hinter seinem Kopf ein rechteckiger Gegenstempel mit Monogramm VAP (?) und darüber ein unbekanntes Objekt (Mondsichel?).

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
