## Description

Front: Kopf des Gaius Iulius Caesar mit Lorbeerkranz nach r. Im l. F. ein Gegenstempel mit Füllhorn (cornucopiae) zwischen C und C.

Rear: Priester mit zwei Ochsen beim Zug der Erstlingsfurche (sulcus primigenius) nach r.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
