Front: Kopf Alexander des Großen mit Ammonshorn und Diadem nach r.

Rear: Nach l. sitzende Athena Nikephoros in Rüstung mit Schild und Speer. Auf dem Thron BY. Im l. F. innen ein Monogramm aus A und P. Im Abschnitt ein Dreizack.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
