Description

Front: Bekröntes dreifeldiges Wappen zwischen Palmwedel und Lorbeerzweig.

Überprägung: Manila / 1828. Gegenstempel Y II unter Krone.

Rear: Stehende Libertad (durch Überprägung unkenntlich). Überprägung: Gekröntes spanisches Wappen. Gegenstempel Y II unter Krone.

Provenience: Seit mindestens 1912 im Bestand des Münzkabinetts.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Overstruck: A coin or medal used as a flan to produce a new coin and that has been struck with a new die.
