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## Description

Front: Cista mystica mit halb geöffnetem Deckel, aus der sich eine Schlange herauswindet. Gerahmt von Efeukranz.

Rear: Zwei sich aufrichtende Schlangen, zwischen ihnen ein Legionsadler (aquila), l. Monogramm aus II, E und P (für Pergamon).

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.
