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Description

Front: Panzerbüste des Caracalla mit Lorbeerkranz in der Brustansicht nach r. Auf dem Brustpanzer ein Gorgoneion. Im r. F. ein runder Gegenstempel mit Kranz.

Rear: Thalassa mit Ruder l. und Ge mit Füllhorn r. stehen in der Vorderansicht und halten gemeinsam nackten, jugendlichen Zeus (Caracalla?). Davor Adler mit ausgebreiteten Flügeln.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.
