Description

Front: Kopf der Tyche mit Schleier und Mauerkrone nach r.

Rear: Blitzbündel mit Binde (taenia) auf einem Tisch. Im r. F. innen I. Das Ganze in einem Lorbeerkranz.

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Scratched: One or more scratches, intentional or unintentional. Can be the result of recovery or subsequent handling of a coin or medal.
