## Description

Part(s) broken away: Sections of the coin or medal are broken away (without any traces of mechanic manipulation).

Reverse reinforced: The practice whereby the reverse of a thin coin (e.g. a medieval bracteate) is reinforced by a collector or a restorer in a museum in order to conserve or stabilise it.
