Description

Front: Drapierte Panzerbüste des Valerianus I. mit Lorbeerkranz in der Brustansicht nach r.
Rear: Felicitas steht in der Vorderansicht, den Kopf nach l. gewandt. Sie hält in ihrer r. Hand einen Merkurstab (caduceus) und im l. Arm ein Füllhorn (cornucopiae).
Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.
Scratched: One or more scratches, intentional or unintentional. Can be the result of recovery or subsequent handling of a coin or medal.
