## Description

Front: Umlaufend Nennung von Nominal, Münzstätte und Prägejahr. Im Feld das Glaubensbekenntnis. Als erkennbare Randzier O zwischen einfachem und doppeltem Linienkreis.

Rear: Umlaufend Koranzitat 9:33. Feld mit Koranzitat 112:1-4. Als Randzier 5x o auf Linienkreis. Feld von gezacktem Kreis eingefasst.

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.

Quartered: The result of intentional division producing a quarter of the original.
