Description

Front: Kopf der Athena mit attischem Helm nach l.

Rear: Ein oben gebundener Olivenkranz. Das Ganze in vertieftem Quadrat.

Chop mark: A mark of undefined form made normally with a chisel-like tool, for example to test the purity of the core of a coin. It can also be the result of damage caused when the object was found.

Part(s) broken away: Sections of the coin or medal are broken away (without any traces of mechanic manipulation).
