Description

Front: Kopf des Traianus mit Lorbeerkranz nach r. Vor dem Kopf ein rechteckiger Gegenstempel mit ΔAK.

Rear: Gottheit mit Tiara steht in einem Viergespann (quadriga) nach r. In der l. Hand ein Zepter. Darüber EN (Jahr 55).

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
