Description

Front: Cista mystica mit halb geöffnetem Deckel, aus der sich eine Schlange herauswindet. Das Ganze gerahmt von Efeukranz.

Rear: Zwei sich aufrichtende Schlangen, zwischen ihnen ein Köcher. Im l. F. außen [Λ]AO, darüber Δ. Im r. F. ein geflügelter Hermesstab (kerykeion).

Pierced: Intentional hole(s) pierced through a coin so that it can be worn on a necklace, sewn onto textiles, etc. In case of paper money such a perforation often indicates devaluation.

Scratched: One or more scratches, intentional or unintentional. Can be the result of recovery or subsequent handling of a coin or medal.

Pecked: Marks made by pointed instrument (e.g. a knife) onto the surface of the coin.
