Description

Front: Kopf der Athena mit korinthischem Helm nach r. Zwei runde Gegenstempel mit je einem achtstrahligen Stern auf Helm und Hals.

Rear: Statue der Athena Ilias auf einer Basis nach l. In der r. Hand hält sie geschultert einen Speer und in der l. Hand einen Spinnrocken.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
