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Description

Front: In einem Viereck das sächsische Wappen. Darüber Buchstaben. Beiderseits neben dem Wappen die Jahreszahl. Unten Gegenstempel G für Gotha oder Grimmenstein.
Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
Inscribed upon (by hand): An object has been inscribed by hand with ink etc.
