Description

Front: Drapierte Panzerbüste des Septimius Severus mit Lorbeerkranz in der Rückenansicht nach r. Ihm gegenüber (eradiert) Geta nach l. Dort runder Gegenstempel mit behelmttem Kopf der Roma nach r., unten rechteckiger Gegenstempel ΘΕΟΥ.

Rear: In Vorderansicht stehende Hekate, Kopf mit Polos l., mit einer brennenden Fackel in der l. und einer Schale (phiale) in der gesenkten r. Hand, die sie zum Opfer über einen Altar zu ihrer l. Hand hält. Doppelschlag.

Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.

Defaced: Parts of the image or inscription of a coin, medal or token have been removed/erased. To be used in particular for cases of damnatio memoriae. See also the concepts for re-cut/tooled and recut die.
