Description

Front: Kopf des Marcus Agrippa mit Schiffsschnabelkranz (corona rostrata) nach l.
Rear: Neptunus steht in der Vorderansicht, den Kopf nach l. Er hält auf der r. Hand einen Delphin und im l. Arm einen Dreizack. Beiderseits S - C. Im l. F. ein rechteckiger Gegenstempel.
Countermarked: The impression left by a countermark punch. A tool that is used to punch into a coin subsequent to the original striking an additional mark or symbol that had meaning in the contemporary context of the coin - for example to mark a specific payment or to revalue a coin). Objects from early modern collections sometimes bear countermarks as a sign of ownership.
